

Stained Glass Windows - Fabric Requirements

1 Panel - Pieced Blocks with 3" Border

8" Blocks

1/3 yard - Background fabric - White

• Cut 10 ½" strip, then cut (2) 10 ½" blocks and (1) 10 ½" x 14 ½"

9 ½" Blocks

1/3 yard - Background fabric - White

• Cut 12 ½" strip, then cut (2) 12 ½" blocks and (1) 12 ½" x 16 ½"

1/2 yard - Border fabric - Black

- Cut (3) 3" strips
- Cut to measured size of length of sewn blocks.
- The cut to measured size of top and bottom of sewn blocks.



1 Panel - Quilted Blocks and Borders – using Embroidery Batting as Stabilizer

(Note: Background fabric is hooped with the Embroidery Batting to provide a tighter hoop.)

8" Blocks - Total 2/3 yard of White and 2/3 yard of Black

1/3 yard - Background fabric - White

• Cut 12 ½" strip, then cut (2) 12 ½" blocks and (1) 12 ½" x 16 ½"

1/3 yard - Backing fabric - White

• Cut 10 ½" strip, then cut (2) 10 ½" blocks and (1) 10 ½" x 14 ½"

9 ½" Blocks – Total 1 1/4 yards of White and 2/3 yard of Black

1/2 yard - Background fabric - White

• Cut (2) 14" strips, then cut (2) 14" blocks and (1) 14" x 18"

1/3 yard - Backing fabric - White

• Cut (1) 12" strip, then cut (2) 12" blocks and (1) 12" x 16 1/2"

2/3 yard - Joining Strips and Binding - Black

Joining Strips fabric

- Cut (5) strips at 1" for <u>top joining</u> strips. Cut 2" longer than measurements of blocks to be joined together.
- Cut (5) strips at 1 ¼" for **bottom joining** strips. Cut 2" longer than measurements of blocks to be joined together.
- Cut (3) strips at 3 ½" for binding.

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1 Panel - Quilted Blocks and Borders – using NO Show Mesh as Stabilizer and securing embroidery batting with background fabric via the basting stitch (step 1 in the design). This method makes the Background fabric and Backing fabric are the same size.

- 1. <u>Hoop the No Show Mesh, then stitch the basting stitch</u> (color change 1) on top of the No Show Mesh.
- 2. <u>Go back to color change 1, center embroidery batting and background fabric on top of hoop within basting stitches.</u>
- 3. <u>Secure embroidery batting and background fabric with basting stitches (color change 1)</u>

NOTE: cut embroidery batting 1" larger than trimmed block size.

8" Blocks - Total 2/3 yard of White and 2/3 yard of Black

1/3 yard - Background fabric - White

- Cut 10 ½" strip, then cut (2) 10 ½" blocks and (1) 10 ½" x 14 ½" 1/3 yard <u>Backing fabric</u> White
 - Cut 10 ½" strip, then cut (2) 10 ½" blocks and (1) 10 ½" x 14 ½"

9 ½" Blocks – Total 1 yard of White and 2/3 yard of Black

1/3 yard - Background fabric - White

- Cut (1) 12" strip, then cut (2) 12" blocks and (1) 12" x 16 1/2"
- 1/3 yard Backing fabric White
 - Cut (1) 12" strip, then cut (2) 12" blocks and (1) 12" x 16 1/2"

2/3 yard - Joining Strips and Binding - Black

Joining Strips fabric

- Cut (5) strips at 1" for **top joining** strips. Cut 2" longer than measurements of blocks to be joined together.
- Cut (5) strips at 1 ¼" for **bottom joining** strips. Cut 2" longer than measurements of blocks to be joined together.
- Cut (3) strips at 3 ½" for <u>binding</u>.
